1	NREGA (MoRD)	Wages, Material	Water conservation/ Harvesting, drought proofing, irrigation canal, irrigation facility to SC/ST/BPL?IAY, Renovation of Water Bodies, land development, flood control and rural connectivity
2	Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) (MoRD)	Wage, Material	Road
3	Watershed Programmes (MoRD+MoA)	Wages, Material, Training	Watershed development works
4	RKVY (MoA)	Wage, Material, Training	Holistic development of agriculture and allied sectors

5	NHM (MoA)	Wage, Material, Training	Holistic growth of the horticulture sector, enhance horticulture production, promote, develop and disseminate technologies
6	NFSM (MoA)	Training & Subsidies	Increasing production of rice, wheat and pulses through area expansion and productivity enhancement in a sustainable manner in the identified districts
7	Grassland Dev (MoA)	Training and Subsidies	Improvement of degraded grass land and also the vegetation cover of problematic soils like saline acidic and heavy soil. Grass / Fodder cultivation
8	Backward Regions Grant Fund (BRGF (MoPR)	Material, Training	Bridge critical gaps in local infrastructure, capacity building, and professional support

9	National Afforestation Programme (MoEF)	Wage, Material, Training	Protection, conservation of natural resources, checking land degradation, afforestation, capacity endowment and skill enhancement
10	Dug well recharge scheme & G.W. Mgt. and Regulation scheme(MoWR)	Wage, Material, Training	Diverting excess rainwater into the dug well through sand filter and ground water management
11	Repair, Renovation and Restoration of Water bodies (MoWR)	Wage, Material	Restore and augment storage capacities of water bodies, desilting and renovation

12	Command Area Dev. & Water Mangt. (CAD&WM) (MoWR)	Wage, Material	Efficient utilisation of created water potential, on-farm development works
13	Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Prog.(AIBP) (MoWR)	Wage, Material	Major, medium and minor irrigation projects, extension, renovation & modernization
14	Flood control & River management (MoWR)	Wage, Material	Flood management works
15	Farmers Participation Action Res.Prog. (FPARP) (MoWR)	Training & Subsidies	Field demonstration to enhance yield and income per drop of water



National Agriculture Development Programme (NADP)

Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana
(RKVY)



The Context

- Post-reform deceleration in agricultural growth
- Decreasing investment by States in agriculture sector
- Acute stress on nearly 60% of workforce dependent on agriculture
- New deal required that rebuilds hope about farming.



NDC Resolution

“Introduce a new Additional Central Assistance scheme to incentivise States to draw up plans for their agriculture sector more comprehensively, taking agro-climatic conditions, natural resource issues and technology into account, and integrating livestock, poultry and fisheries more fully...”



Objectives

- Incentivizing States to increase public investment in agri. & allied sector
- Preparing agriculture plans for districts and States
- Flexibility and autonomy to States in planning and executing schemes
- Better reflection of local priorities
- Reducing yield gaps in important crops
- Maximizing returns to farmers
- Bringing about quantifiable changes in the production and productivity



Basic Features

- State Plan scheme
- NADP funds to be provided as 100% grant
- Eligibility criteria



Eligibility Criteria

- Must maintain, or exceed, the baseline expenditure on agri. & allied sector (baseline is moving average of previous three years)
- Prepare agriculture plans for the districts and the State



Preparation of District Plans

- Consult the Guidelines of Planning Commission for preparation of District Plans
- Draw up District Agriculture Plans also reflecting State's priorities
- Integrate, not merely aggregate, district plans to prepare State Agriculture Plan
- Ensure convergence with schemes such as NREGS, BRGF, SGSY and Bharat Nirman
- Show progress in 2007-08 with a roadmap
- All districts to have plans from 2008-09
- Consultants can be hired (Can be paid out of 1% of scheme funds for admn. expdr.)



Outlay

- 11th Five Year Plan envisaged outlay: Rs. 25,000 crore
- Outlay for 2007-08 – Rs. 1,500 crore



Allocation Criteria

- Percentage share of net un-irrigated area of the State to the total net un-irrigated area : 20% weight
- Percentage share of total projected Gross State Domestic Product (2011-12) : 30%
- Increase in Plan expenditure on agri. & allied sector : 50%



Streams of Funding

- **Stream I** : Major food crops, Mechanization, Soil Health, Rainfed Farming, Watersheds, Seed Farms, Pest Mgmt., Hort., Extension, Marketing, A.H. & Fisheries, Intt. Support, Study Tours, Fertilizers, Innovation
 - Projects to be prepared for approval of State Level Sanctioning Committee headed by Chief Secretary and having GOI representative
 - At least 75% of NADP funds & can be increased to 100%.
- **Stream II** : Strengthening of the existing schemes and for filling resource gaps under the State Plans proposals
 - Proposals will be approved by Planning Commission as part of State Plan exercise
 - Limited to maximum 25% of NADP funds



Action Points for Implementation

- Identification, or creation, of a Nodal Agency (Agri. Deptt. will have overall responsibility) – by 15.10.2007
- Constitution, and notification, of State Level Sanctioning Agency (SLSC) – by 15.10.07
- Preparation of agriculture plans for districts and State – by 30.11.2007
- Identification of projects and preparation of DPRs for approval of SLSC under Stream-I (Consultants can be hired but payment made only after approval of DPRs with 5% provision) – by 30.11.2007
- Preparation of proposals for approval of Planning Commission under Stream-II – by 30.11.2007



Comprehensive District Agricultural Plan (C-DAP)



Objectives

- To prepare a Comprehensive District Agriculture Plan (C-DAP) through participatory process involving various organisations and stakeholders.
- To enable optimum utilisation of scarce natural, physical & financial resources.
- To assess and plan for the infrastructure required to support the agriculture development.
- To establish linkages with the required institutional support services, like credit, technology transfer, ICT, research etc.
- To evolve an action plan for achieving sustainable agricultural growth with food security and cropping system that will improve farmers' income.



Vision Document

- To generate a common development perspective of the district
- To work out an inspiring goal for aggregate overall development of the area.
- To envisage and incorporate roles of women and disadvantaged groups
- To picture optimal utilization of the available resources
- To foresee needs and level of human and infrastructure development
- To motivate people of the area and gear up all segments of population for facing the challenges
- To act as a goal post towards which the entire planning process should be oriented.
- To help people of the area in developing more realistic, objective oriented, and executable five year and annual plans.



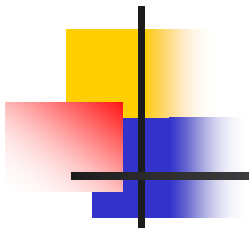
Methodology and Process

- Formulation of Vision Statement
 - Information Needs and Analysis
 - Discussion on the Vision
 - Preparation of Participatory Panchayat Plans
 - Integration of Village Panchayat Plans into a Block/Taluk Plan-Intermediate Level
 - Integration of Taluk/Block Plans into a District Plan
 - Approval by DPC
 - Submission of District Plan to State Government and Feedback to District/Panchayats
 - Monitoring
 - Social Audit
